Parks

A welcome escape from the hustle and bustle of the busy urban life, a visit to one of the city's parks is among the many ways to unwind and whilst spending quality time with loved ones. Dubai is home to a number of parks, such as Zabeel Park, Burj Park, Al Mamzar Beach Park, Safa Park Creek Park and Mushrif Park. Meanwhile, Dubai Safari Park and Dubai Crocodile Park provide memorable experiences for the community. Dubai Safari Park, a wildlife reserve, animal sanctuary and education centre, is home to over 2,500 animals from all over the world, making it a unique tourism and edutainment destination. The Dubai

Crocodile Park is home to the majestic freshwater Nile crocodile, and will help visitors learn more about the endangered species.

Another exciting way to enjoy the weekend is to visit the Dubai Miracle Garden. Featuring over 150 million flowers of over 120 varieties, the Dubai Miracle Garden is the world's largest natural flower garden and is one of the most beautiful attractions in Dubai. All of the plants and flowers in Dubai Miracle Garden are fashioned into various stunning arches, patterns and shapes, making for a colourful sight – practically picture perfect.

Beaches and water parks

Dubai's beach culture ensures that there's always something for everyone, whether you want to play a game of beach volleyball with friends, curl up with a book or even enjoy a nice picnic on the sand. Among the options across the city are "The Beach" in JBR, which includes a range of restaurants, hotels, lounges and entertainment places for families, Kite Beach, which is popular for surfing and beach sports, Sunset Beach, which offers views of the Burj Al Arab, and Al Mamzar Beach, which provides a suitable environment for relaxation and swimming, together with pathways for walking and cycling. Off the coast, sports enthusiasts can indulge in jet skiing, surfing, and so much more.

Water parks are fun-filled family attractions, and a splendid way to escape the heat. Legoland Water Park has rides for all ages, so the entire family can enjoy their day out; Wild Wadi, in front of the Burj Al Arab, offers many entertaining experiences for kids and their parents; and there's even Laguna Water Park in La Mer – a modern park featuring a variety of rides catering to thrill seekers – as well as Aquaventure Waterpark at Atlantis the Palm, the largest of its kind in Dubai.

Hatta

Hatta is the perfect getaway from the city lights, providing an opportunity to get back to nature as well as to experience a wide range of activities. You could go mountain biking or hiking in the Hajar Mountains – also known for its stunning views – or enjoy wadi-bashing in the riverbeds and even go kayaking in the Hatta Dam. The Hatta Wadi Hub offers visitors experiences such as a 10-metre high climbing wall that includes five lanes, a slingshot that propels those looking for adventure, fun and suspense to a height of up to 50 meters, and paragliding.

Skydive Dubai

Skydive Dubai caters to anyone craving an adrenaline rush and welcomes skydiving enthusiasts to enjoy the spectacular views while flying high over the Palm Jumeirah. If you are skydiving for the first time, you can jump in tandem with a professional coach to enjoy a safe experience.

The XLine

Try the longest zipline in the world – the XLine – which is located in Dubai Marina Mall. The XLine is one of the steepest and fastest ziplines around the globe, and has multiple lines, which means that family and friends can delight in the fantastic views together.

Hot Air Balloon

A hot air balloon ride treats people to a magnificent bird's eye view of Dubai. Amazing sights start to appear on every trip, such as the mountains, Bedouin villages, camels and dunes, making it the ultimate adventure.

Sports
